Encourage Your Students to Read More with EBooks and Audiobooks from the Prairie Point Library



- * Reading for pleasure is correlated with improved achievement in all academic areas
- * Use the Follett Enlight App to access over 900 ebooks, books you can read on your

smartphone, iPod touch, or tablet.

- * Students use their regular **Prairie username** (the first part of their student email address) and **password** to login
- *First time set up: type wbb12215 in the http:// box





- * Research shows that audiobooks improve adolescent literacy by improving fluency, increasing vocabulary, and improving motivation to read.
- *Encourage students to read along while they listen to an audiobook.
- * Use the Catalist Digital app to access our library's growing collection of audiobooks.
- * Username & password are the same for all students. Username: **point** Password: **books**

Why Databases?

Students will be doing research projects in several classes this year. Prairie Point and area education agencies provide databases of high quality resources that are intended for K-12 students.

Materials in these databases are reliable and written at the appropriate reading level for students. The databases also give students help in citing sources properly. Using databases of high quality resources is usually better and easier than just using Google to find information for student projects. Check out the databases available to Point students. Information in red font indicates which password you will need to access that database.

Here are the passwords you will need:

Gale - remote password: library

High School - username: prairiehs, password: library

Students also have these passwords inside the cover of their agenda.
