Grades K+ (Adult/Child)

It's All About Clay - Adult/Child

Let your creative juices flow as you learn all about clay. You will handbuild using coils, slabs, pinch pots and molds to make your projects. Finish your work with innovative techniques in decoration and slip application. Working with clay has never been so much fun.

Storybook Clay - Adult/Child

Create clay objects based on your favorite storybooks. Make Cinderella bookends, Three Bears wind chimes or ogre cups. Finish your creations using glazes, colored slips and paints.

Luncheon Clay - Adult/Child

Design and make your own place setting - plate, bowl, and cup. Add you favorite designs with colored slips and glaze. Use your one of a kind place setting for snacks, lunch or dinner. You will have the most unique dinner table on the block when this class is done.

Grades 1-4

Musical Clay

Create musical instruments like maracas, rain sticks, rattles and pick cup. Use glazes and slips to add pizzazz to your pieces. At the end of class, you will be able to march to your own drum.

Dream House in Clay

It's All About Clay

Do you love the feeling of clay in your hands? What would you like to make? Will it be a lion, a bowl for ice cream or a jewelry box for your treasures? You will learn all about clay, hand building and decorating techniques. You will discover the properties of building with clay slabs, coils and pinch techniques and explore the world of clay sculpture as well as practical and useful items. Make your own ceramic masterpieces!

Image Transfers on Clay

Students will learn several low tech ways to transfer their drawings to clay projects. Techniques include relief prints and cylinder seals, monotyping, and tissue transfers.

Wheel Thrown Clay

Cups, bowls, bottles, and vases: learn how to throw these - and other forms - on the potter's wheel. Students of all skill levels are welcome. This class will cover wedging, centering, pulling, trimming, use of tools, surface decoration and glazing. Each student will work on their own wheel and learn the basics of throwing and shaping clay into cylinders and bowls. Students should wear old clothes and shoes as throwing on the wheel is very messy.

Projects in Glass

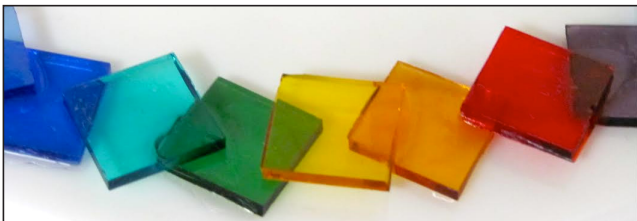
