

The lowa Trip

For the past seventeen years, junior and senior high school students from Japan have been visiting lowa for several weeks every March. A Japanese student is paired with their lowa "buddy" and together they attend school and learn about each other's culture. The students are accompanied by an American teacher, from their school in Japan, who is available to support both parents and students during the three week period.



Why are we coming to lowa?

Most of our students have limited experience outside of Japan, so they are keen to learn more about the US and to experience life here. While in lowa our students are able to practice their English and hopefully develop meaningful friendships with students their own age. Through this cultural exchange, we hope that both students and host families are able to broaden their understanding of other cultures and create lasting international friendships.

Date of Visit: Sat., Feb. 25 — Sat., March 11, 2017

Expectations for Buddies & Host Families:

- Family must have a child in senior high school (preferably gr. 10 or gr. 11). We match students by age, gender and interests.
- Treat your Japanese student as a member of your family by including them in daily family activities and weekend or spring vacation plans.
- Allow the Japanese student to "buddy up" with your child and attend the same classes at school.
- Pick your student up at the airport when the group arrives (February 25th) and return the student to the airport at the end of the trip (March 11th).
- 5) Provide a safe and secure homestay experience with meals and a bed (sharing a room with a sibling of the same gender close in age is fine).
