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Language Intervention And Science Learning Study

Does your child have a language delay?



Our Study

We are studying the effects of teaching children to use complex sentences during science lessons.

Who Qualifies?

Preschool and Kindergarten children who struggle with receptive or expressive language, or who have a history of language delay. Children must not have a diagnosis of autism, hearing impairment or cognitive impairment.



What happens during the study?

Children participate in 4-5 screening and pre-test visits, including language and science assessments.

Eligible children receive 5 testing visits and 25 science instruction visits. These include both science instruction only visits and science instruction which includes language treatment. This takes about 14 - 19 weeks.

Children receive up to \$40.00 for participation.



Where is the study?

We can meet in our laboratory at the University of Iowa, or at another location in the Iowa City or Quad Cities area, such as at a preschool or library meeting room.
